

SEEING STARS - BLOCK 9

Ohio Star Variation

This is a 20" (20-1/2") block created using templates. No math or fancy rulers are needed.

Note: Choose the same background fabric for your entire quilt. You will need approximately 6 yards of background fabric.

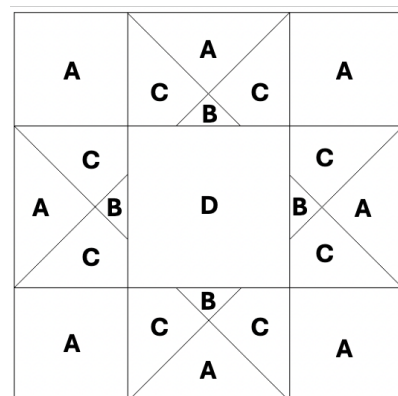
Fabrics / Quantity

Fabric A (Background): 10" x WOF

Fabric B (Star Points): 5" square

Fabric C (Star Points): 8" x WOF

Fabric D (Center Square): 9" square



Cutting Instructions

Before cutting the fabrics, press them using Best Press or a similar product to stabilize the fabric and make it easier to work with.

Fabric A: Cut [4] 6-3/8" squares and [1] 9-1/2" square.

- Subcut the 9-1/2" square diagonally, corner to corner, in both directions. You will have [4] Fabric A triangles.

Fabric B: Cut [1] 4-1/2" squares.

- Subcut the squares diagonally, corner to corner, in both directions. You will have [4] Fabric B triangles.

Fabric C: Cut [4] Shape A and [4] Shape B pieces. The templates for these shapes are on page 2. **See**

Diagram 1.

Fabric D: Cut [1] 8-7/8" square.

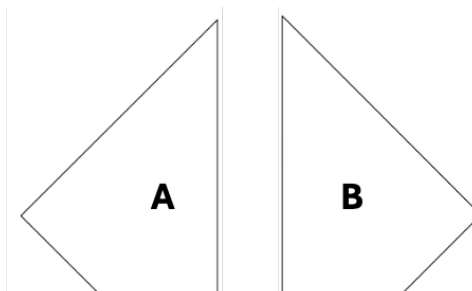

Block Assembly

Step 1: Arrange and sew Fabric A triangles and Fabric C (Shape A) pieces. Make [4]. Press. Pay close attention to the orientation of each piece.

See Diagram 2.

Step 2: Arrange and sew Fabric B triangles to the Fabric C (Shape B) pieces. Make [4]. Press. Pay close attention to the orientation of each piece. **See Diagram 3.**

Step 3: Arrange and sew the units you completed in Steps 1 and 2. Press. Make [4]. These units should measure $6\text{-}3/8"$ x $8\text{-}7/8"$. **See Diagram 4.**

Step 4: Arrange the units into rows: **See Diagram 5.**

- Row 1:** $6\text{-}3/8"$ Fabric A square / A/B/C Unit / $6\text{-}3/8"$ Fabric A square. Press
- Row 2:** A/B/C Unit / $8\text{-}7/8"$ Fabric D square / A/B/C Unit. Press
- Row 3:** $6\text{-}3/8"$ Fabric A square / A/B/C Unit / $6\text{-}3/8"$ Fabric A square. Press

Step 5: Arrange and sew the rows together. Press.

Your completed block should measure $20\text{-}1/2"$ square.

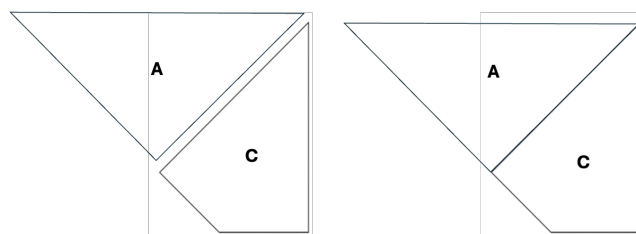
